## **HB2015 On Second Reading; SB12 Heads to the Floor**

- House Bill 2015 dealing with local health boards is on second reading today. This bill would require commissioners to approve or ratify health policy determined by the local health boards.
- This would open up commissions to a great deal of liability. CCAWV feels that public health should stand alone and commissioners do not want this liability.
- There are 48 health boards (some county, some county-city and some are multiple counties) and there were only a few examples given regarding health department local control. This has more to do with issues such as liquor sales and masks that have occurred during the pandemic.
- Please contact your House representatives and tell them that counties do not want this liability. There are methods in place to remove appointees if necessary.
- SB12 is on first reading.

## **SB270**

SB270 relating to collection of tax by hotel marketplace facilitators is on the Senate Gov Org agenda today at 2:00 pm. Carol Fulks and Ritchie Heath with WVHTA will be monitoring. This bill is single referenced. Our understanding is that they are going to do a committee substitute for the bill that will correct language so that the remittance will go directly to counties and municipalities.

## **SB32**

Senate Bill 32 was pulled last week from Senate Finance agenda. It is still referred and there are ongoing conversations. The tax department is waiting on some data to come back and then there will be another work group meeting. Appears to be some confusion regarding the bill. Assessors are heavily involved in this.
